INFORMATION PERTAINING TO GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE VILLAGE OF WORMS – 1892

- 1. The **village of Worms** is located on the top of the Zaregol ravine, populated by the Government in 1809 with foreign colonists.
- 2. Location -- 93 versts away from Odessa,

to the police station -- 35 versts,

to a JP or a chief of the Zemstvo -- 35 versts,

to the volost administration -- 6 versts,

to the nearest post-telegraph office -- 40,

to the nearest state post office -- in the village,

to the Zemstvo post office -- 18 versts,

to the hospital -- 15 versts,

to the district physician -- 15 versts,

to the church -- in the village,

to the nearest market -- 15 versts (in Berezovka) and 18 versts (in Mostovoye).

- 3. How the correspondence goes forth and back -- through the post station of Worms.
- 4. **Of whom the community consists** -- the community consists of villagers-owners (former German colonists); the land is in a plot hereditary use being managed publically by all owners, landless villagers use pastures with the permission of owners only; besides, the company of 42 Wormsers has purchases 850 desiatines of land at the village of Worms for collective use, no one lives on this land.
- 5. Are there any private land plots belonged to those residing outside -- none.
- 6. Any desiatinschiks/intellectuals residing in the village (organized within a special separate group?) -- 26 families of intellectuals arrived from various places; no separate chairman/policeman established, no natural duties served nor public taxes paid.
- 7. Ponds and wells, water taste, depth of wells, soil layers and their thickness:
 - -- in the village -- no ponds, 22 wells
 - -- in adjacent steppes -- 7 ponds and 5 wells

- -- water taste -- fresh in 5 wells and salty in 22 ones, ponds are filled with snowand rainwater exclusively
- -- wells' depth -- 4 sazhens
- -- soil layers -- 1 arshin of black-soil, 2.5 sazhens of yellow clay, 1.5 arshin of stony ground and 2 arshins of white clay
- 8. **Kind of soil of adjoined steppes** -- 8 vershoks of the upper layer are of saltpetre black soil with the clay underneath
- 9. **Description of adjoined steppes** -- not hilly but with many ravines; no watered lowlands; about 70 desiatines of rocky land
- 10. **Description of green** -- 15 desiatines forest planted by the villagers (acacia trees), no shrubberies.
- 11. Bazaars, fairs in the village -- not gathered.
- 12. **State establishments in the village** -- state horse post and post-office for correspondence reception and giving out.
- 13. The Zemstvo institutions -- a town-councillor.
- 14. **Social/public establishments in the vil**lage -- the village administration, village chairman, village clerk, one village policeman and 6 assistants of him, a lock-up for convicts forwarded, apartments for arriving officials to stay, public store and public inn, a school for deaf-mutes.
- 15. **Churches, prayer houses in the village** -- one Reformed Church and one Lutheran prayer house.
- 16. Schools -- two parochial schools,

one Reformed school (teacher -- Peter Bauer, maintenance of the teacher and school -- 700 Roubles a year),

one Lutheran school (teacher -- Immanuel Schech, maintenance of the teacher and school -- 650 Roubles a year to be collected by the community);

classes in the schools last from August 15 to April 1;

number of students in the Reformed school -- 58 boys and 65 girls, in the Lutheran one -- 58 boys and 58 girls;

both schools are placed in separate public buildings.

17. Land attached at the village (in desiatines):

- -- allotted for the village community -- total 5,058, arable 2,717, meadows 120, pastures (grazed fields) 1,931, homesteads with adjacent pastures 113, vegetable gardens 73, orchards 2, forests and shrubberies 15, under roads 43, under a river/lake/pond 14, under stones/gullies/salt-marshes 26
- -- purchased and used by a company of villagers -- arable 834, under roads 16
- -- in all -- 5,908

- 19. **Roads** -- post road from Odessa to Voznesensk; the Zemstvo has provided and is maintaining a convenient communication through the Zaregol ravine all the year round; a

durable bridge; country roads to Rohrbach, Riasnopol and Moctovoye are also in good shape and available all through the year.

- 20. **Nearest railways** -- no railway close to Worms, the nearest railway station of Vradiyevka (of Ananiyev uyezd) is 80 versts away; access road to there is not convenient; no goods are brough to there for further transportation but by unpaved way to the towns of Odessa, Nikolayev and Voznesensk.
- 21. **Historical/archaeological monuments** -- there are three burial mounds in Worms steppes, no more historical or archaeological monuments available, nothing is known to old inhabitants about that.
