People from Danzig arriving in Alt-Schwedendorf in 1787 and according to the census of 1795 moving on to Alt-Danzig up further north in 1793/94:

Lasin, Michael 56; his wife Christina Dorothea 58 and daughter Constantia Dorothea 19.

Lasin, Gottlieb 26; his wife Katharina Danielstochter 30. Lasin = Lessin.

Engel, Krestian 40, his wife Maria Dorotia 34 and their children: Krestian 17, Karl 12, Anna Rosina 3, Anna Elisabet 3 and Kristian 1.

Janke, Michael 33; his wife Anna Magdalena 34 and their children Marie-Louisa 3 and Barbara 1.

Janke, Georg 29 (brother to Michael) and his wife Anna 24.

Repin, Johann 50; his wife Maria Elisabeth 45, their daughter Wilhelmina 12 and the orphan Herman Jakob Michelson 19.

Knitter, Martin 47; his wife Anna Barbara 43 and their children Anna 17, Elisabeth 13 and Johann 9.

Christoffer, Adrian 42; his wife Anna Dorothea 43 and their children Johann 16, Christina 14, Katharina 10 and the step-daughter Katharina 9.

Zilke, Jakob 57; his wife Barbara 54, their adult son Peter 36 and his wife Barbara 36 and their children Andreas 15 and Johann 13. The orphans: Heinrich 22 and Helena 16.

Albrecht, Johann Daniel 55; his wife Sofia 55 and their daughter Anna 16.

Along with these followed one Swedish family arriving 1782 from the island of Dagoe in Estonia:

Mickel Hindriksson born Sep 27 in 1761 in the village of Roicks on Dagoe and his wife Walba (Walborg) Tönnisdotter born Jan 10 in 1765 in the village of Koidma on Dagoe. The couple married Dec 8 in 1784 in Alt-Schwedendorf. Their children: Christina born Aug 8 in 1785 – died Aug 20 the same year, **Andreas** born Aug 16 in 1786 and **Johan** born March 18 in 1789. (These brothers were called Michaelson.)
