Purchase contract

Between the Alexanderhilfer Christian Wohl and Johannes Roth on February 10, 1864 with following stipulations:

Alexanderhilf Colonist Christian Wohl sells his house No. 63, located in the Alexanderhilf Colony, including all the associated establishments as well as the empty fenced-in lot located behind the house to Alexanderhilf Colonist Johannes Roth as an inviolable property to children and children's children for the sum of seven hundred seventy five R. S. (Silver Ruble)

At the signing of the purchase contract, Johannes Roth paid the seven hundred seventy five S. R. in cash to Christian Wohl and such is acknowledged herewith.

Johannes Roth has to take care of all debts and payments that entail on this house

Assuring that Wohl and Roth bound this contract with the consent of their families and that they will faithfully honor it, they certify with their signatures while asking the honorable Authorities for favorable endorsement of this purchase contract.

19 February 1864 To the Alexanderhilf Magistrate's office

After review of the reports from the Alexanderhilf Magistrate's office of the 10th of this month under No. 105 in regard to the hand-over of the homestead of Alexanderhilf colonist Christian Wohl to the likewise Alexanderhilf colonist Johannes Roth, the Liebenthal District office came to the following conclusion during it's session on February 18 of this year:

After review of the reports from the Alexanderhilf Magistrate's office of 10 February this year under no. 105 and the accompanying documents like:

- 1. The contract bound between Alexanderhilf colonists <u>Christian Wohl</u> and <u>Johannes Roth</u>, in which the first wishes to hand over his homestead in the colony Alexanderhilf, recorded under no. 63, inclusive of all buildings and establishments and the latter wishes to make a payment of seven hundred seventy five silver Ruble.
- 2. The declaration of the community Alexanderhilf stating that they have no objections to the transfer, the Liebenthal District's office has decided to authenticate the transfer of the homestead of <u>Christian Wohl</u> to colonist <u>Johannes Roth</u> to the Alexanderhilf Magistrate's office.
