The following is an excerpt from the book *The History of Sacred Heart Church, Park, Kansas* by Pastor Rev. Peter L Burkard S.T.L. submitted by Pius Waldman. The excerpt is a listing of the 1938 church membership.

Chapter XIV

Statistics and the Last Census

In July 1938 it will be 40 years since Bishop Hennesey of Wichita, administrator of Concordia, granted permission for building the first church at Park.

On September 8, 1938, it will be 40 years since the property for a church site and for a cemetery was deeded to the Bishop.

On September 14, 1938, it will be 40 years since the Ohio Waisenfreund, a German Catholic weekly, published an advertisement describing the opportunities of getting cheap and good farm land around Park.

On December 12, 1938, it will be 40 years since the first settlers from South Russia living in Texas, influenced by the above-mentioned advertisement, arrived at Park and gave the impulse for so many friends to follow them. At present, the congregation in its majority consists of German-Russians and their children.

When the first church was completed in 1900, there were twenty-two families: 1 Geo. Birrer; 2 John Fahey; 3 Henry Feldt; 4 John Feldt; 5 John Forster; 6 George Forster; 7 Joseph Forster; 8 John Jegen;; 9 Charles Kane; 10 Nikolaus Mardian; 11 Philip Martin; 12 John Meier; 13 David Mosier; 14 A. Nester; 15 Edward Norton; 16 H. Ploeger;

17 Alexander Schwarz; 18 Peter Schamber; 19 John Schmidt; 20 Daniel Zimmermann; 21 Rochus Zimmermann; 22 Frank Zimmermann. There were also two single men: Anton Kroner and B. Wessel.

In 1905 the number of families increased to eighty-nine not including a few single men, according to the information by John Loevenstein. The Liber Status Animarum, however, has listed for the year 1905 only sixty-two families; it is possible, however, that the list in the parish record is not complete.

In 1910, after the Catholics around Grainfield had separated from Park, the Liber Status Animarum shows fifty-eight families only; according to the same book in 1923 there were 154 families. The first census taken up by Rev. Fr. Burkard September 1, 1928, shows 157 families with 974 souls. By November 15, 1932, this number had increased to 185 families with 1072 souls, and January 5, 1938, to 194 families with 1079 souls.

The Registrum Matrimoniorum starts in November 1905 and reports 178 marriages.

The Registrum Baptismorum starts in February 1904 and contains 1977 baptisms. The record continues in the Liber Baptismorum begun December 4, 1931, and up to December 31, 1937, lists 216 baptisms.

The record of Interments starts with January 22, 1906, and reports the burial of seventy-five adults and children.
